

## Some Tips and Resources for houseplant care

There are many resources and tools available to assist in having healthy, thriving plants in your home. With a little research and your commitment, you can find all the information you need to take care of your specific plants.

To research your individual plants' needs, be sure to properly identify the plants. You can do this with *specific* plant markers from the grower, books, or computer searches and apps.

Once you're certain your plant has been properly identified, you can seek reliable sources of information for plant care. Beware of well-intentioned advice from non-scientific sources. You can be assured of good information from various university extension websites or your county extension office. For example, to find information on Philodendron, entering a search phrase Philodendron extension.edu will yield 25+ sources.
