What makes 4-H unique?

4-H makes learning fun! In 4-H, young people work with peers and adult volunteers to learn new skills, practice leadership, give back to their community, and make new friends. They learn about topics that interest them through hands-on activities. The 4-H slogan is for youth to 'learn by doing'.

4-H is delivered in two ways to Ocean County youth:

Clubs – Youth are invited to participate in a 4-H club that meets annually throughout the program year (September – August). Clubs meet monthly or seasonally. Clubs have approved adult volunteers who work with members to organize the club's schedule of events and meetings. There is no limit to the amount of clubs a member wants to participate in. Club members may also participate in S.T.E.P. opportunities.

Short Term Exploratory Program (S.T.E.P.) – Youth are invited to participate in S.T.E.P., in which they are not a part of a specific club, but rather participate in Ocean County 4-H through a series of short-term programs that are organized by county 4-H Staff or approved adult volunteers. When these programs are available, they are held once a year or multiple times in a season. S.T.E.P. members may also join regular 4-H clubs.

In addition to participating in county-level clubs and S.T.E.P., 4-H members also have the opportunity to participate in NJ State 4-H Level programs and National 4-H Level programs!
