ANNUALS & PERENNIALS

ANNUALS: Putting the "WOW" Factor in Your Garden

Pretty Perfect Perennials

There are many beautiful perennials that will grow well in Ocean County if you place them in a favorable location according to their needs. This presentation will show you season by season what plants will bloom best in your garden.

Shade Gardens: Plants for Sun Starved Gardens

Want a beautiful garden but only have shade? This presentation will offer many suggestions and ideas for annuals and perennials that prefer and thrive in the shade.

SHRUBS

Hydrangeas- When, Why and How?

NATIVE PLANTS

Gardening Down the Shore

This presentation speaks to the shore issues of sand, wind, and salt explaining ways they affect the possible plants that can be grown successfully. It also addresses soil improvements, mulching, and choosing the correct plants for the site.

Native Plants of Ocean County

This presentation explains the importance of planting native plants. Native plants: perennials, trees, shrubs and grasses are most suited to Ocean County's soil and growing conditions and will flourish with the proper care.

Native Plants: Environmental Impact

VEGETABLE GARDENING

Pest Management (IPM) for Vegetable Gardens

Starting a Vegetable Garden: Let's Proceed

Starting a Raised-Bed Vegetable Garden: Let's Pro-Seed

Learn how to start a vegetable garden from identifying the perfect plant placement to harvesting your crops using a raised bed for plantings.

CONTAINER GARDENING

Container Gardening- Flowers or Vegetables

Don't have a lot of space to plant a garden? Think container gardens for your patio and deck. Pot size, soil requirements, watering and plant selection will be discussed.

GARDEN TOPICS

Butterflies and Hummingbirds in your Garden

This presentation will discuss the environmental importance of these pollinators in your garden. Essential host and nectar plants will be discussed.

Deer Resistant Plants

Deer are everywhere and in increasing numbers. We need to coexist with the deer, but we still want beautiful gardens. Annuals, perennials and shrubs will be discussed that are not so appetizing to deer. Tips to prevent deer from eating your plants will be discussed.

The "Dirty" Secrets of Invasive Plants

Invasive plants are overgrowing our native plants. A few of our favorite plants are now considered invasive. This presentation will provide information on alternative plants. Current NJ legislation will be presented.

Early Spring Pruning

Winter is over and now you need to get your gardens ready for Spring plantings. Tips on which plants need to be pruned and how to best accomplish this task.

Edible Flowers: Color, Flavor and Fun

There are many edible flowers that can be used in breads, cookies, jams, and teas. This presentation will discuss the various edible flowers and their many uses. Recipes will be provided.

Fall: Putting your Garden to Bed

This presentation will discuss ways to clean out your garden beds; protect trees, shrubs and tender plants; eliminate sources of disease and insect infestation; and prepare tools for winter storage. Cleaning up your garden in the Fall will make your Spring planting easier.

Planting Garlic (Fall Topic)

A presentation of the various types of alliums and garlic along with their care will be presented. A demonstration of planting and harvesting technique will be included.

Landscaping with Ornamental Grasses

Looking for easy care plants that have year-round interest? Think ornamental grasses. There are many varieties with interesting colors and foliage to brighten your garden.

Landscaping for Winter Interest

This presentation will provide information regarding flowers and shrubs that have winter appeal. Plants that have changing leaf color, changing stem color, long bloom periods, attraction to birds that can brighten up your garden will be discussed. Winter gardens do not have to be boring and dreary!

Long Seasons of Color in Your Garden

This presentation reviews a sampling of colorful plants and flowers including both annuals and perennials that will bring an ever-changing rainbow of color to your garden throughout all four seasons of the year.

Planting Bulbs for All Seasons

Oh, so many bulbs to choose from! Bulbs that bloom in the Spring, Summer or Fall will be discussed. Tips on when and how to plant bulbs and how to design a garden with bulbs, including daffodils, alliums and snowdrops will be discussed. *This presentation can be a lecture or a demonstration*.
